

INTRODUCTION



The fascinating brilliance of the Khajuraho Group of Temples is the reason it is named among the UNESCO World Heritage sites in India.

GWALIOR, It's known for its palaces and temples, including the Sas Bahu Ka Mandir intricately carved Hindu temple. Ancient Gwalior Fort occupies a sandstone plateau overlooking the city and is accessed via a winding road lined with sacred Jain statues. Within the fort's high walls is the 15th-century Gujari Mahal Palace, now an archaeological museum.

VARANASI, Considered as the holiest of Hindu cities, it is as old as civilization and the very town breathes divine bliss. Known as the city where life comes to a full circle, as it is witness to Indian rituals of birth to death. Varanasi is probably one of the most ancient living cities in India.

RISHIKESH, It has spectacular view of jungle-clad hills. Rishikesh has also confluence of River Ganges and Chandrabhaga. In the ancient time and still so many yogis, rishis, sages and sannyasis attracted to Rishikesh to practice yoga in this peaceful location. Since then, Rishikesh has known as an abode of sages. Rishikesh is a holy town with so many Ashrams and it is famous for the yoga world wide.

AMRITSAR, It is the proud owner of the Golden Temple that serves as a spiritual center for the World's entire Sikh population. It is the epicenter of Sikhism, an Indian religion of a recent vintage. The fabric of the city seems to be woven around the temple.

SAMODE, on way to Shekhawati, this small village is famous for its haveli and fort. Samode is connected to Jaipur through a good network of roads. Unlike the other havelis of Rajasthan, the Samode Palace does not belong to any royal family but a family of noblemen, the Rawals of Samode.

RANTHAMBORE, Is one of the best wildlife sanctuaries in India with incredible bio-diversity. Formerly the hunting grounds of the royal family of Jaipur, Ranthambore has now become the sanctuary of wildlife. Also, in the lush premises of the national park lies the 10th century Ranthambore Fort, which is a part of the Hill Forts of Rajasthan which have been granted the status of a UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

BHARATPUR, Bharatpur Bird Sanctuary, currently known as the Keoladeo Ghana National Park. The amazing diversity of species of avians as well as wildlife without doubt is the reason the major lure for Bharatpur tours. Rajasthan is widely known for its imposing architectural buildings, including forts, palaces, havelis and temples those built by the Rajputs and Jats. Most of these massive structures date back to the medieval era, of which few have been converted into government edifices and heritage hotels and few have been retained as private residences of the royal family. Most of these monuments were built as part of defence strategies, to defend territories from the being attacked by enemies and also to give shape to the immense passion of the rulers of yesteryears towards art and architecture.

BIKANER, City will mesmerize you with the camels sauntering its beautiful sand dunes and captivate you with its ancient palaces and forts. Bikaner with its magnificence in architecture, art and culture has sands filled with colour, festivity and cultural marvels. Bikaner is also famous for hosting the international Camel festival which draws tourists from world over.

KHIMSAR, To explore the district of Nagaur the desert village of Khimsar provides an excellent starting point and also offers an attractive insight into the rural life of the desert people. Every year Nagaur Cattle Fair attracts thousands of tourists which is a major tourist attraction.

POKARAN, Means "the place of five mirages", it is enclosed by sandy, rocky and five salt ranges. Fort Pokaran stands amidst the Thar desert, it is a premier fort of the clan of Rathores of the JAISALMER, Also known as "The Golden City" of state Rajasthan, The city is built on a ridge of yellowish sandstone, and ancient Jaisalmer fort is the crown of the city. Sculptured sandstone was used to build many houses and temples of both town and fort. Thar Desert (the Great Indian Desert) surrounds the entire city, having a total population of 78,000.

JODHPUR, Also Known as the "Gateway to Thar", it is famous for its Mehrangarh fort, blue houses, temples, sweets and snacks. Apart from the fort, there are multiple temples, lakes, shopping streets that are like a mirage from a bygone era. Other charms of Jodhpur include Government museum and it's beautiful Umed garden. The city is known as the "Sun City" because of its bright and sunny weather throughout the year.

ROHETGARH, Sprawling over acres of manicured gardens, Rohet Garh Heritage is sure to seduce you at first sight. Situated far from the madding crowd on the banks of a lake and set in the midst of rural surroundings, it is a royal retreat. The lakeside palace has been lovingly restored to its former glory - and, as the ancestral seat of nobility in the local maharaja's court, it's safe to say its past was rather colourful.





KUMBHALGARH, It is surrounded by thirteen hill peaks of the ranges and is perched at an elevation of 1,914 m. The magnificent fort is situated in the middle of a forest which has been turned into a wildlife sanctuary. It offer the panoramic view of the surroundings along with the sand dunes of Thar Desert.

UDAIPUR, The royal kingdom reverberates with many legends of bravery with the most respectable of all Rajput princely states in Rajasthan. The places to visit Udaipur include the royal palaces, temples, gardens, the bylanes, etc.

CHITTORGARH, Also called Chittaur, evokes memories of great heroism and sacrifice by Rajput men and women in the intermittent battles that they had to fight against invaders from Northwest. The city stands strewn with monuments and battlements as evidence of the blood and gore that it went through in medieval times.

NIMAAJ, It is a tranquil hideaway in the heart of the Aravalli Hills and an excellent place to relax and unwind during a tour of Rajasthan.





BODHGAYA, A place where Lord Buddha left his foot steps nearly 2500 years ago while travelling in the quest of enlightenment, situated by the river Phalgu, Bodhgaya is one of the most important and sacred Buddhist pilgrimage center in the world.





Mahabaahu provides an unshowy but very comfortable base from which to view all this action. Its large-windowed cabins -- several of which have balconies -- allow good views of the riverbanks (though for closer attention to the animals, guests board one of two well-cushioned, open-topped tender/expedition boats).

Though not a 'luxury boat' by today's Western standards, Mahabaahu is well presented with crisp linen cloths and napkins in the dining room, silk hangings and cushions on the beds, and comfortable seating in the main Soma Lounge, up on the sun deck, and around the pool.

The crew is friendly and attentive, and the itinerary fascinating and a good introduction to the subcontinent for those wary of the crowds and chaos along the banks of India's most famous river, the Ganges.

MV Mahabaahu runs seven-night sailings along the Brahmaputra, either upstream, from Guwahati to Jorhat, or downstream in the other direction.

The scenic backwaters of Kerala comprise serene stretches of lakes, canals and lagoons located parallel to the coast of the Arabian Sea. It takes great skill and meticulousness to construct and navigate these giant Houseboats by tying huge planks of Anjili tree and the staff has been trained properly.

Kerala Backwaters are a network of interconnected canals, rivers, lakes and inlets, a labyrinthine system formed by more than 900 km of waterways. In the midst of this landscape there are a number of towns and cities, which serve as the starting and end points of backwater cruises. The backwaters have a unique ecosystem – freshwater from the rivers meets the seawater from the Arabian Sea.

In certain areas, such as the Vembanad Kayal, where a barrage has been built near Kumarakom, salt water from the sea is prevented from entering the deep inside, keeping the fresh water intact. Many unique species of aquatic life including crabs, frogs and mudskippers, water birds such as terns, kingfishers, darters and cormorants, and animals such as otters and turtles live in and alongside the backwaters. Palm trees, pandanus shrubs, various leafy plants and bushes grow alongside the backwaters, providing a green hue to the surrounding landscape.














GUJARAT
















TIBET
